

Sometimes it's a professor's life with minor dabbles in their classroom. What is never depicted is the staff that actually runs the day to day functions of the university, ensures quality out of the classroom experiences, holistic growth of students & deals with emergencies. What is student affairs?

To paraphrase a major professional organization for student affairs professionals the National Association of Student Personnel Administrators (NASPA). Learning mostly happens outside of the classroom. Opportunities for teaching and development can happen everywhere on campus, from an academic advisor helping a student choose a major to a fraternity and sorority life coordinator helping a chapter to operate more effectively. The work done by student affairs professionals helps students begin a lifetime journey of growth and self-exploration. Student affairs professionals seize these moments and promote positive interactions. While furthering understanding for diversity and belief in the worth of individuals.

St. Sebastian University will showcase this often un-spotlighted profession, its impacts, its idiosyncrasies, quirks, problems its faces through the perspectives and personal lives of five students affairs professionals of varying ages & experiences that belong to various facets of the queer community and work in departments like Cultural/Identity Offices, Fraternity & Sorority, Housing, Orientation and Student Conduct. As they gather after a week of work and unwind at a local gay bar. There will also be a minor focus of the uniqueness of Jesuit Catholic universities that will also be showcased.

This television series is a love letter and advocation of student affairs and the queer community from a bisexual practitioner of student affairs whose life was changed by student involvement as his way of giving back. It is also a great opportunity for student affairs professionals to laugh at the sillier things that happen in the field and help explain what they do for a living to their confused family and wider public. Hopefully this also results in higher wages and benefits for student affairs practitioners and makes higher education a human right for all and not just some.

Structure

A half hour sitcom with a linear narrative with only some episodes having serialized elements in later seasons. Each season is a semester at St. Sebastian University. There are ten seasons of ten episodes each for one hundred total episodes that is complimented by a finale tv movie. Most episodes have one of the lead characters recount a situation in either their work or personal life to the other lead characters through flashbacks while the lead characters are at one of four local gay bars in Buffalo. Most often while the leads are at the Frut Loop on Friday nights. A small number of episodes entirely take place in one of the four bars. The series of flashbacks can take place practically anywhere with the focus of the episode like a conference in San Diego for example. Flashbacks can be interrupted and or paused by the questions and statements of the other leads. Some flashbacks are completely oral if it plays out better for comedy or plot.

Tone

The overall picture is rosy but thorns will be shown. The show celebrates student affairs professionals but highlights various problems and unfairness that they can face. Jubilation is chased by soberness most often by not overwhelmed by it. Good often wins out but not without personal or professional growth first.

Themes

Student Affairs is more adept than Academic Affairs when it comes to problem solving.

Involvement is just as important to an education as most learning comes outside of the classroom. Students learn more from our leads than their professors.

Student Affairs is as essential to society and a more ethical career field than most but not completely above systemic problems.

Student Affairs is a field where queerness can be an advantage but not completely understood like in all others.

Many problems students face are because of their parent's attitudes and shortcomings in failing to raise them as part of multicultural intersectional society. I.E. Coming into a university with eighteen years of baggage.

An education is about becoming an informed and prepared citizen in a democracy and not job training. A job training point of view will ultimately make students and staff miserable in their lives before and after graduation.

Background

Silly Skunks: An informal gathering of queer student affairs staff at St. Sebastian most Friday nights at the Frut Loop since the early 2010s. The current group was initiated when Wesley met Harold, after many previous had left the institution to more senior positions, at the Frut Loop one night when Wesley was first starting out at St. Sebastian, later absorbed Freddie then Ximena before Tina encountered the group. Harold came up with the moniker when a group chat was formed.

Locations

St. Sebastian University

A Catholic Jesuit university founded in 1880 in Buffalo, New York. With an average enrollment of

6,000 students. Academically it is known for its African American Studies, Classical Studies, Interior Design & Supply Chain Management programs. It has a similar national profile to Marquette University in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

Originally a school for the sons of Polish immigrants of the Our Lady of Lake Erie parish started by Rev. Wincenty Dziuba with help from parish families. An avid archer, he named the college after Saint Sebastian, the patron saint of archers and subject of many classical paintings. In 1919 St. Sebastian settled in its current location with the completion of both Ambroziak Hall & the Chapel of St. Sebastian. In 1953 it gained university status.

Its colors are French Gray & Crimson. Athletics teams are known as the St. Sebastian Skunks. The unusual moniker was chosen by the student body in jest in 1919 after an early football game was ended by skunk or mercy rule. The mascot is Shane Skunk, an anthropomorphic skunk represented by a student in costume; there has never been a live skunk at games.

The Skunks compete in NCAA Division One, in the Zenith Conference except for Hockey where the Skunks compete in the Eastern Hockey Conference. Other teams include, Volleyball, Cross Country, Golf, Tennis, Basketball, Track & Field, Baseball & Softball. With most success coming in Women's golf including 10 straight conference championships starting in 1993. Starting a football team has been an annual debate topic that won't be resolved soon.

Campus Buildings

Borkowski Hall

A upperclassmen residence hall built in the 1990s that is also home to the university housing offices.

Cygan Multicultural Center A multicultural student center built in the early 2000s home to the Pride Center.
